Pursuant to the Forests Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Forest Service Fees and Charges Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Forest Service Fees and Charges Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July

1976.

2. New Schedule substituted—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto, and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule hereto.
