PURSUANT to section 48 (2) of the Fire Service Act 1975, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, makes the following order.

ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Fire Service Levy Amendment Order 1999, and is part of the Fire Service Levy Order 1993\* (“the principal order”).

(2) This order comes into force on 1 February 2000.

**2. Rate of levy**—Clause 2 of the principal order is amended—

- (a) By omitting from paragraph (a) (i) the expression “\$3.60”, and substituting the expression “\$4.96”:

(b) By omitting from paragraph (b)(i) the expression “4.50 cents”, and substituting the expression “6.20 cents”.

**3. Revocation**—The Fire Service Levy Amendment Order 1997 (S.R. 1997/369) is consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order, which comes into force on 1 February 2000—

- increases the fire service levy rate for motor vehicles (other than motor vehicles with a gross laden weight greater than 3.5 tonnes) from \$3.60 to \$4.96
- increases the levy rate for other insured property from 4.5 cents to 6.2 cents for every \$100 insured
- consequentially revokes the Fire Service Levy Amendment Order 1997.
