THE FOREIGN SEAMEN (PANAMA) NOTICE 1941.

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General.

WHEREAS it has been signified in writing to me by the Consul of the Government of the Republic of Panama that it is the desire of that Government that Part XIV of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, shall be enforced in respect of the master and seamen of the ships of the said Republic:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby give notice as follows:—

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Foreign Seamen (Panama) Notice 1941.
- 2. The provisions of Part XIV of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, will be enforced in respect of the masters and seamen of the ships of the Republic of Panama from and after the 1st day of October, 1941.
