PURSUANT to section 1 (2) of the Guardianship Amendment Act 1991, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Guardianship Amendment Act Commencement Order 1991.

2. Commencement of Guardianship Amendment Act 1991—The Guardianship Amendment Act 1991 shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1991.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order brings into force, on 1 August 1991, the Guardianship Amendment Act 1991.

That Act provides for the implementation, in New Zealand, of the Hague Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction, and makes consequential amendments to the Guardianship Act 1968. New Zealand acceded to the Convention on 31 May 1991. The Convention will enter into force for New Zealand on 1 August 1991, and the Guardianship Amendment Act 1991 is accordingly brought into force on that date.
