

# THE GAMING AND LOTTERIES (LICENSED PROMOTERS) REGULATIONS 1978, AMENDMENT NO. 1

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 3rd day of March 1980

## Present:

The Right Hon. R. D. Muldoon presiding in Council Pursuant to section 66 of the Gaming and Lotteries Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Gaming and Lotteries (Licensed Promoters) Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Gaming and Lotteries (Licensed Promoters) Regulations 1978\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Payment of additional expenses—Regulation 17 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after subclause (1), the following subclause:

"(1A) Notwithstanding subclause (1) of this regulation, where a society on whose behalf a licensee is conducting or has conducted a prize competition or lottery is satisfied—

"(a) That, after the licensee agreed to conduct the prize competition or lottery, there has been a change of circumstances, beyond the licensee's control, which resulted or will result in the licensee incurring additional expense in conducting the prize competition or lottery; and "(b) That the change of circumstances and the incurring of that additional expense could not reasonably have been foreseen by the licensee,—

the society may pay to the licensee, and the licensee may accept, the whole or any part of that additional expense; but the society shall not be under any obligation to make any such payment, and any contract or arrangement purporting to impose such an obligation upon the society shall be void."

3. Abolition of limit on number of prize competitions and lotteries conducted—Regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations are made pursuant to section 66 of the Gaming and Lotteries Act 1977, and amend the Gaming and Lotteries (Licensed Promoters) Regulations 1978.

Regulation 1 relates to the Title and commencement.

Regulation 2 amends regulation 17 of the principal regulations. Subclause (1) of that regulation limits the amount that a promoter may claim by way of expenses to 15 percent of the gross proceeds of the sale of tickets. The new subclause empowers the client society to meet any additional expenses resulting from any unforeseen change of circumstances beyond the control of the licensee. However, the society cannot be compelled to make any such payment.

Regulation 3 revokes regulation 18 of the principal regulations, which prohibits licensees from conducting more than 20 prize competitions or lotteries in any

licensing year.
