### **RULES**

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These rules may be cited as the Guardianship (International Child Abduction) (Forms) Rules 1991.
  - (2) These rules shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1991.

  (2) Every application under section 19 (1) of the Guardianship Amendment Act 1991 shall be in form 2 in the Schedule to these rules.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These rules, which come into force on 1 August 1991, prescribe the forms to be used for the purposes of applications made under section 9 or section 19 of the Guardianship Amendment Act 1991.

Section 9 of that Act relates to applications for the return of a child abducted from New Zealand.

Section 19 relates to applications for the effective exercise of rights of access in respect of a child resident outside New Zealand.
