THE GAME REGULATIONS 1975, AMENDMENT NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of December 1976

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 61 and 83 of the Meat Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Game Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Game Regulations 1975* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1977.

2. Fees—Regulation 149 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraphs (a) and (b), and substituting the following paragraphs:

- “(a) For every carcass of deer, chamois, thar, pig, or goat \$0.90:
- “(b) For every carcass of farmed deer \$2.70:
- “(c) For every carcass of hare \$0.10.”

3. Appeals under section 78 of Act—Regulation 152 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the word “licensee” in both places where it occurs, the words “or applicant”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 2 increases the inspection fees prescribed by regulation 149 of the principal regulations, and inserts a new fee for the inspection of hares.

Regulation 3 makes an amendment to regulation 152 of the principal regulations which is consequential on the amendment to section 78 of the Meat Act 1964 (effected by section 52 of the Meat Amendment Act 1976) whereby an applicant for a licence under Part IV of the principal Act may appeal against a refusal to grant him a licence.
