**THE GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS (STAFF) REGULATIONS
1953, AMENDMENT NO. 24**

PURSUANT to the Government Railways Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

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REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 24, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting after regulation 52 the following heading and regulation:

“Architectural Staff

“52A. (1) No member or probationer shall be designated as an architectural graduate unless he is a graduate with a diploma or degree in architecture of a University in New Zealand.

“(2) No member or probationer shall be designated as an architectural associate unless he is the holder of a degree in architecture from a University in any country other than New Zealand, and that degree is acceptable as a qualification for membership of the New Zealand Institute of Architects.

“(3) No architectural graduate or architectural associate shall be designated as an architect unless he is a member of the New Zealand Institute of Architects or is registered as an architect under the Architects Act 1963.

“(4) No architectural graduate or architectural associate shall be eligible for promotion beyond Grade 2 of Class 4 until he is registered as an architect under the Architects Act 1963.

“(5) For the purpose of this regulation the term “architect” includes any member designated as an architect on the lists for the time being last issued pursuant to regulation 36 hereof, and if a question arises whether or not any person is an architect so as to be subject to this regulation the question may be decided by the General Manager.”

3. Regulation 64 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “Plumbers Registration Act 1912”, and substituting the words “Plumbers and Gasfitters Registration Act 1964”.

4. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulations 145, 146, 147, 148, and 149, and substituting the following regulations:

“145. (1) Every apprentice, who in any year ending with the 31st day of December,—

“(a) Obtains 80 per cent or more of the possible shop marks awarded in pursuance of regulation 30 hereof; and

“(b) Obtains—

“(i) Eighty per cent or more of the possible marks at the annual departmental apprentice examination held in pursuance of regulation 21 hereof, with not less than 65 per cent in any one paper; or

“(ii) A credit pass in any trade examination conducted by the New Zealand Trades Certification Board—

“shall be awarded a diploma allowance at such rate as the General Manager may from time to time determine.

“(2) For the purposes of this regulation the term ‘credit pass’ shall mean a mark not less than the required pass mark plus one-third in the written portion and a pass in the practical portion (if any) of trade examinations conducted by the New Zealand Trades Certification Board.

“146. Any apprentice who, in any year ending with the 31st day of December,—

“(a) Obtains 75 per cent of the possible shop marks awarded in pursuance of regulation 30 hereof; and

“(b) Obtains—

“(i) A pass at the annual departmental examination held in pursuance of regulation 21 hereof; or

“(ii) A pass in any trade examination conducted by the New Zealand Trades Certification Board—

“shall be awarded a diploma allowance at such rate as the General Manager may from time to time determine.

“147. Any diploma allowance payable pursuant to the provisions of regulation 145 or regulation 146 hereof shall be paid during the remaining period of the apprenticeship commencing on the 1st day of February following the date of the examination if the apprentice, in the opinion of the General Manager, maintains a satisfactory standard of work and conduct.

“149. Every diploma allowance shall be in addition to the apprentice’s classified rate of wages.”

5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulations 151 and 152, and substituting the following regulation:

“152. The General Manager may at his discretion accept examination certificates for examinations of a standard satisfactory to him conducted by an educational institution or examining body instead of certificates for annual departmental apprentice examinations.”

6. Regulation 153 of the principal regulations is hereby consequentially amended by omitting the number “148”, and substituting the number “147”.

7. Regulations 154, 155, 156, and 157 and the heading thereto are hereby revoked.

8. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, as substituted by regulation 16 of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 23, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 16 of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 23, and the Schedule thereto are hereby consequentially revoked.

(3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 26th day of August 1964.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for the appointment and promotion of architectural staff in the Railways service and amend the conditions relating to the promotion of plumbers to conform with the Plumbers and Gasfitters Registration Act 1964. They also provide a new scale of salaries for administrative officers up to and including Grade Special 9 and revise the qualifications required for the granting of diploma allowances to apprentices.
