# THE GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS (STAFF) REGULATIONS 1953, AMENDMENT NO. 34

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 18th day of April 1977

THE RIGHT HON. B. E. TALBOYS PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Government Railways Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Government Railways Regulations (Staff) 1953, Amendment No. 34, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Application of Part XVII to the families of female employees— The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 191, the following regulation:

"191A. The provisions of this Part of these regulations shall apply to the family and any member of the family of a female employee and of a retired female employee and of a deceased female employee and a deceased retired female employee in the same manner, with any necessary modifications, as they apply to the family and any member of the family of a male employee and of a retired male employee and of a deceased male employee and of a deceased retired male employee respectively."

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

This amendment extends the provisions relating to free passes, free tickets, and privilege tickets to include the families of female employees.
