THE GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS (STAFF) REGULATIONS 1953, AMENDMENT NO. 6

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Government Railways Act 1949, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. (1) Regulation 2 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 5, is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause (2) the expression "£1,220" and substituting the expression "£1,300".
- (2) Regulation 2 of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 5, is hereby revoked.

- 3. (1) Regulation 9 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:
- "(1) Except as provided in subclause (2) of this regulation, no candidate shall be engaged as a probationer in any occupation unless he possesses the minimum educational qualification for that occupation as specified hereunder or an equivalent or higher qualification:

Occupation	Minimum Educational Qualification Required
Engineering cadet (civil)	Engineering Intermediate Examination of the University of New Zealand.
Engineering cadet (other than civil)	Higher School Certificate.
Clerical cadet	Two years' attendance at a secondary school.
Apprentice Junior mechanician	Evidence that on leaving school candidate was in a class not lower than Form II.
Labourer (except in the Traffic Branch) and Stores Branch) Garage attendant	Evidence that on leaving school candidate was in a class not lower than Standard 4.
In all other cases	Evidence that on leaving school candidate was in a class not lower than Form I."

- (2) Regulation 3 of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 2, is hereby revoked.
- 4. Regulation 57 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:
 - "(4) Any member in the General Division—
 - "(a) Whose period of service in the Department since the date of his last engagement is not less than five years; and
 - "(b) Who, due to sickness or injury or physical defect or bodily infirmity, has, in the opinion of the General Manager, become permanently unfit to perform the duties of his ordinary occupation in the General Division or of any other occupation in that Division to which he is eligible for transfer—

may, at the discretion of the General Manager, be promoted to the position of clerical assistant in the Salaried Division."

5. The principal regulations are hereby amended in the manner indicated in the First Schedule to these regulations.

- 6. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, as substituted by regulation 3 of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 3, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.
 - (2) The following regulations are hereby revoked:
 - (a) Regulation 3 of, and the Schedule to, the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 3:
 - (b) The Schedule to the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 2.
- (3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1956.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide a new scale of salaries for administrative officers in the Department, and redefine the minimum educational qualification for admission to the Department. They also extend the jurisdiction of the Government Railways Industrial Tribunal by providing that an administrative officer in the Railways Department shall be a person holding a position to which is attached a salary in excess of £1,300 a year, and provide that firemen and cleaners in the Locomotive Running Branch shall, in future, be known as locomotive assistants and locomotive trainees respectively, and that members in the General Division who have become unfit to perform their ordinary duties may be promoted to the Salaried Division.
