THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE APPEALS EMERGENCY **REGULATIONS 1944**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 16th day of February, 1944

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Government Service Appeals Emergency Regulations 1944.
 - 2. These regulations apply with respect to—
 - (a) Appeals by officers of the Public Service under section 17 of the Public Service Amendment Act, 1927*:
 - (b) Appeals by members of the Government Railways Department under section 11 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1927†:

Appeals by officers of the Post and Telegraph Department under section 237 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928‡.

- 3. Notice of an appeal to which these regulations apply by an officer or member who has rendered full-time service (whether before or after the commencement of these regulations) as a member of any of His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces may be forwarded to the Public Service Commissioner or the General Manager of Railways or the Director-General of the Post and Telegraph Department, as the case may be, within twenty-one days after the officer or member has resumed duty with his Department, or within such extended time as the Commissioner, General Manager, or Director-General may in any case allow.

4. For the purposes of any appeal to which these regulations apply the fact that any officer or member has at any time since the 3rd day of September, 1939, been absent from duty in his Department or in any branch thereof by reason of service in any of His Majesty's Forces, or by reason of service in any other Government Department or in any other branch of his Department on account of causes arising out of the present war, shall not be taken into account in determining his experience or his efficiency or his suitability for appointment to any position for which he would have been eligible if he had not been absent from duty.
