THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE TRIBUNAL REGULATIONS 1949

Pursuant to the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- These regulations may be cited as the Government Service Tribunal Regulations 1949.
 - In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
 "The Act" means the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948:
 Expressions defined in the Act have the meanings so defined.
- 3. The New Zealand Public Service Association, Incorporated, and the New Zealand Workers Industrial Union of Workers are hereby declared to be the service organizations representing employees of the Public Service.
- **4.** (1) Each member or deputy member of the Tribunal (other than the Chairman or a deputy of the Chairman) shall be paid a fee of £3 3s. for every day or part of a day on which he is in attendance at a sitting of the Tribunal.
- (2) For every day or part of a day in respect of which the Chairman of the Tribunal certifies that any such member or deputy member is otherwise engaged in work in connection with matters under consideration by the Tribunal, the Minister of Finance may approve the payment of a fee of the amount specified in subclause (1) of this regulation.
- 5. (1) Each assessor appointed under section 16 of the Act shall be paid a fee of £2 2s. for every day or part of a day on which he is in attendance at a sitting of the Tribunal.
- (2) For every day or part of a day in respect of which the Chairman of the Tribunal certifies that any assessor is otherwise engaged in work in connection with matters under consideration by the Tribunal, the Minister of Finance may approve the payment of a fee of the amount specified in subclause (1) of this regulation.

- 6. (1) When the attendance of any such member, deputy member, or assessor at a sitting of the Tribunal or in performing work in connection with matters under consideration by the Tribunal requires him to absent himself from his usual place of residence for a continuous period of twenty-four hours or longer, or for a period involving his leaving and returning on successive days, there shall be paid to him by way of travelling-allowance (in addition to all locomotion expenses actually and reasonably incurred) the sum of £1 5s. for every day or part of a day on which he is so absent.
- (2) For the purposes of this regulation a day means a period of twenty-four hours commencing at midnight, and every period of absence shall be computed from and to the times of departure from and return to the usual place of residence of the member, deputy member, or assessor.
