THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Government Service Tribunal Regulations 1950.
- (2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1950.
- 2. The annual salary which must be attached to a position held by a person employed in the Public Service so as to constitute that person an "employee" as that term is defined in section 2 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, shall be a salary not in excess of £1,080 instead of a salary not in excess of £1,060 as prescribed in the said section as amended by section 2 of the Government Service Tribunal Amendment Act, 1949.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

An "employee" is defined in section 2 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948 (as amended by the Government Service Tribunal Amendment Act, 1949), as not including any person holding a position to which is attached an annual salary in excess of £1,060 or of such other amount as may from time to time be prescribed. The purpose of regulation 2 is to substitute "£1,080" for "£1,060."
