THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE TRIBUNAL REGULATIONS 1950

ORDER IN COUNCIL

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Government Service Tribunal Regulations 1950.

(2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1950.

2. The annual salary which must be attached to a position held by a person employed in the Public Service so as to constitute that person an "employee" as that term is defined in section 2 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948, shall be a salary not in excess of £1,080 instead of a salary not in excess of £1,060 as prescribed in the said section as amended by section 2 of the Government Service Tribunal Amendment Act, 1949.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

An "employee" is defined in section 2 of the Government Service Tribunal Act, 1948 (as amended by the Government Service Tribunal Amendment Act, 1949), as not including any person holding a position to which is attached an annual salary in excess of £1,060 or of such other amount as may from time to time be prescribed. The purpose of regulation 2 is to substitute "£1,080" for "£1,060."
