

THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE TRIBUNAL REGULATIONS 1955

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Government Service Tribunal Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Government Service Tribunal Regulations 1955.
- (2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of November 1955.
 - 2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 "The Act" means the Government Service Tribunal Act 1948:
 Expressions defined in the Act have the meanings so defined.

PUBLIC SERVICE

- 3. The following organizations are hereby declared to be service organizations in so far as they represent employees of the Public Service:
 - (a) The New Zealand Public Service Association Incorporated:

 - (e) The Wellington, Nelson, Westland, and Marlborough Local Bodies, other Labourers, and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers:
 - (f) The New Zealand Musicians Industrial Union of Workers:
 - (g) The New Zealand Engineering, Coachbuilding, Aircraft, and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers:

- (h) The Auckland Painters and Decorators Industrial Union of Workers:
- (i) The Auckland Ship, Yacht, and Boatbuilders Industrial Union of Workers:
- (j) The New Zealand Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers:
- (k) The Auckland Bricklayers Industrial Union of Workers:
- (1) The Auckland District Boilermakers, Iron Ship Workers, and Bridgebuilders Industrial Union of Workers:
- (m) The North Island Electrical Trades Industrial Union of Workers:
- (n) The Auckland Ceramic, Concrete, Builders, and General Labourers Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers:
- (o) The Auckland Saddlers, Collarmakers, Bagmakers, Sailmakers, Riggers, and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers:
- (p) The Auckland Iron and Brass Moulders Industrial Union of Workers:
- (q) The New Zealand Educational Institute:
- (r) The New Zealand Post-primary Teachers Association (Registered).
- 4. The maximum salary for the purposes of the definition of the term "employee" in section 2 of the Act shall be the salary for the time being payable to officers of Subdivision 2 of Class Special of the Clerical Division of the Public Service.

EDUCATION SERVICE

- 5. (1) The provisions of the Act are hereby applied to the Education service.
- (2) For the purposes of this regulation and for the purposes of the Act as applied by this regulation, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "Controlling authority" means the Director of Education:
 - "Education service" means the branch of the Government service comprising—
 - (a) Teachers employed by Education Boards, Secondary School Boards, Technical School Boards, Combined School Boards, and Free Kindergarten Associations; and
 - (b) Students and trainees receiving allowances or salaries from any such Board or Association:
 - "Employee", in relation to any Board or Association referred to in the foregoing definition of the term "Education service", includes any student or trainee receiving an allowance or salary from the Board or Association, and references to salary, wages, or pay include any such allowance:
 - "Official Circular" means the New Zealand Education Gazette:
 - "Service organization" means a service organization specified in subclause (3) of this regulation.
- (3) The following organizations are hereby declared to be service organizations representing employees of the Education service:
 - (a) The New Zealand Educational Institute:
 - (b) The New Zealand Post-primary Teachers Association (Registered).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations consolidate the Government Service Tribunal Regulations

(No. 2) 1949 and their amendments.

Only two changes are made in the regulations as previously amended. Regulation 4 prescribes the maximum salary for the definition of the term "employee" in the Government Service Tribunal Act 1948 as the salary payable to officers in Subdivision 2 of Class Special of the Clerical Division of the Public Service. This salary is at present £1,220. Previously the maximum salary for defining the employees subject to the jurisdiction of the Government Service Tribunal was £1,110.

In regulation 5 (2) the term "Official Circular" is defined as meaning the New

Zealand Education Gazette in relation to the Education service.
