ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 77 and 199 of the Transport Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Goods Service Vehicle (Constructional) Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Goods Service Vehicle (Constructional) Regulations 1936\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November 1989.

**2. Offences and penalties**—Regulation 11 (4) of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Goods Service Vehicle (Constructional) Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 3) is hereby amended

by omitting the expression “subsection (4)”, and substituting the expression “subsection (1)”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations correct a cross-reference to the appropriate penalty provision in section 30 of the Transport Act 1962.

From 1 November 1989 offences against the Goods Service Vehicle (Constructional) Regulations 1936 may be proceeded with as infringement offences pursuant to Part IX of the new Second Schedule to the Transport Act 1962, as enacted by the Transport Amendment Act 1989.
