HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Hospitals Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Hospital Board Employees (Conditions of Employment) Regulations 1947, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hospital Board Employees (Conditions of Employment) Regulations 1947* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from the definition of the term "industrial agreement" the words "and includes an agreement filed with a Clerk of Awards under section 8 of the Labour Disputes Investigation Act, 1913".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

The principal regulations provide for the appointment by the Minister of advisory committees to advise him on matters concerning the conditions of employment of certain Hospital Board employees, excluding employees whose conditions of employment are for the time being fixed by, *inter alia*, any industrial agreement as defined.

The effect of the amendment is to permit an advisory committee to advise on conditions of employment of persons whose conditions of employment are fixed under an agreement filed with a Clerk of Awards under section 8 of the Labour Disputes Investigation Act, 1913.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette* : 1st day of June, 1950. These regulations are administered in the Department of Health.
