HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 51C of the Judicature Act 1908 (as substituted by section 4 of the Judicature Amendment Act (No. 2) 1985), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and with the concurrence of the Right Honourable the Chief Justice and at least two of the other members of the Rules Committee (of whom at least one was a Judge of the High Court), hereby makes the following rules.

RULES

1. Title and commencement—(1) These rules may be cited as the High Court Amendment Rules (No. 3) 1987, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the High Court Rules from time to time set out in the Second Schedule to the Judicature Act 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the High Court Rules).

(2) These rules shall come into force on the 1st day of September 1987.

2. Place of trial—Rule 123 of the High Court Rules is hereby amended by repealing the proviso, and substituting the following proviso:

“Provided that where that office is situated at Masterton the place for the trial of the proceedings shall be Wellington and where that office is situated at Tauranga the place for the trial of the proceedings shall be Rotorua.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These rules, which come into force on 1 September 1987, amend rule 123 of the High Court Rules.

The amendment is consequential on the establishment, on 1 September 1987, of an office of the High Court at Tauranga. The amendment provides that where the office in which a statement of defence is to be filed is situated at Tauranga, the place for the trial of the proceedings, if a trial is necessary, shall be Rotorua.
