PURSUANT to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Health (Diseases Communicated by Animals) Regulations 1965, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Health (Diseases Communicated by Animals) Regulations 1965* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.

2. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "a fee of 3s. 6d.", and substituting the words "a fee of 5s.".

3. (1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in the list of communicable diseases set out in that Schedule, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the following items:

"Anthrax. Rabies."

(2) The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby consequentially amended by inserting in the list of diseases set out in the Note on the form of notification contained in that Schedule, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the following items:

"Anthrax.

Rabies."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations make two amendments to the Health (Diseases Communicated by Animals) Regulations 1965.

Regulation 2: Under section 87A of the Health Act 1956 every veterinary surgeon and every person in charge of a laboratory must, in certain circumstances, notify the Medical Officer of Health if he has reason to believe that any animal is suffering or has suffered from a communicable disease to which that section applies. These regulations increase the fee payable for each notification under that section from 3s. 6d. to 5s. Regulation 3 applies section 87A of the Health Act 1956 to two more diseases—

namely, anthrax and rabies.
