ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of June 1962

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Heathcote Estuary Foreshore Licence Order 1962.
2. In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - “The Council” means the Christchurch City Council; and includes its successors and assigns:
 - “Master” means the person for the time being in charge of any vessel, whether or not he is certificated:
 - “The said jetty” means the jetty referred to in clause 3 of this order:
 - “Vessel” has the same meaning as in the Harbours Act 1950.

PART I—FORESHORE LICENCE

3. The Council is hereby licensed and permitted to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark in the Heathcote Estuary, at the foot of Mount Pleasant Road, Sumner, as shown on plan marked M.D. 5031 and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of maintaining thereon a jetty as shown on the said plan.
4. The licence granted under clause 3 of this order shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) The Foreshore Licence Regulations 1960* shall apply with respect to the licence:
 - (b) The annual sum payable by the Council in respect of the licence shall be 1s., payable on demand:
 - (c) The term of the licence shall be 14 years from the date of this order.

PART II—REGULATIONS AS TO USE OF JETTY

5. The master of every vessel discharging ballast at the said jetty shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

6. No person shall fish from the said jetty at any time while organised yacht racing is being held in the Heathcote Estuary.

7. No person shall ride a bicycle or motor cycle or power cycle on the said jetty.

8. Every person who commits a breach of this Part of this order commits an offence, and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £5.
