HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Hospitals Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Hospital Employment (Medical Officers) Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hospital Employment (Medical Officers) Regulations 1964* (hereinafter referred to as the special regulations).
- 2. (1) Regulation 7 of the special regulations is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule to that regulation (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Hospital Employment (Medical Officers) Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following Schedule:

- (2) The scales of salaries specified in the Schedule to regulation 7 of the special regulations (as substituted by subclause (1) of this regulation) shall be deemed to have come into force on the dates respectively shown under the headings of the columns headed "Yearly Rate of Salary on and from 26 August 1964", "Yearly Rate of Salary on and from 1 January 1965", and "Yearly Rate of Salary on and from 1 August 1965".
- 3. The special regulations are hereby further amended by revoking regulation 8 (as substituted by regulation 4 of the Hospital Employment (Medical Officers) Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following regulation:
- "8. A final year student, while employed in a relieving capacity in the place of a junior house surgeon, shall be paid a salary at the yearly rate of £895 on and from 26 August 1964, £1,017 on and from 1 January 1965, and £1,067 on and from 1 August 1965, and while he is so employed the provisions of regulations 8A, 17, and 18 of these regulations shall apply to him as if he were a house surgeon."

4. (1) Regulation 11 of the special regulations is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule to that regulation (as substituted by regulation 7 of the Hospital Employment (Medical Officers) Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following Schedule:

- (2) The scales of salaries specified in the Schedule to subclause (3) of regulation 14 of the special regulations (as substituted by subclause (1) of this regulation) shall be deemed to have come into force on the dates respectively shown under the headings of the columns headed "Nominal Whole-time Salary From Which Salary of Visiting Medical Officer is Computed on and from 26 August 1964", "Nominal Whole-time Salary From Which Salary of Visiting Medical Officer is Computed on and from 1 August 1965", and "Nominal Whole-time Salary from Which Salary of Visiting Medical Officer is Computed on and from 1 April 1966".
- 6. Regulations 3, 4, 7, and 10 of the Hospital Employment (Medical Officers) Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 1, are hereby revoked.

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide amended conditions of employment for medical officers and final-year medical students employed by Hospital Boards.
