PURSUANT to the Apiaries Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Honey Export Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Honey Export Regulations 1950* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1978.

2. Grading and regrading fees abolished—Regulations 15 and 17 (3) of the principal regulations are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations abolish fees payable for the grading and regrading of honey for export as from the 1st day of October 1978.
