THE HOSPITAL EMPLOYMENT (PHYSIOTHERAPISTS) REGULATIONS 1952, AMENDMENT NO. 3

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Hospitals Act 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Hospital Employment (Physiotherapists) Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hospital Employment (Physiotherapists) Regulations 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the special regulations).
- 2. (1) Such of the provisions of these regulations as have the effect of increasing the rates of salaries, wages, and other emoluments and increments payable in respect of the classes of persons whose positions are specified in these regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of January 1955.
- (2) Except as provided in subclause (1) of this regulation, these regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 3. Regulation 3 of the special regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the term "subsidiary training school", the following new definitions:
 - "'Tuberculosis institution', 'tuberculosis ward', and 'tuberculosis annex' mean respectively an institution, ward, and annex wholly conducted for the reception or treatment of persons suffering from tuberculosis; and the term 'tuberculosis ward' includes a ward mainly conducted for the reception and treatment of persons suffering from tuberculosis:"

4. (1) Regulation 4 of the special regulations is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule to that regulation (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Hospital Employment (Physiotherapists) Regulations 1952 Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following Schedule:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations prescribe new scales of salaries for certain classes of physiotherapists employed by Hospital Boards, and also prescribe additional payments to physiotherapists employed in tuberculosis institutions similar to those already paid to nurses.
