## THE HOSPITAL EMPLOYMENT (ORTHOPAEDIC TECHNICIANS) REGULATIONS 1952, AMENDMENT NO. 1

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Hospitals Act 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Hospital Employment (Orthopaedic Technicians) Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hospital Employment (Orthopaedic Technicians) Regulations 1952\* (hereinafter referred to as the special regulations).

2. (1) Such of the provisions of these regulations as have the effect of increasing the rates of salaries, wages, and other emoluments and increments payable in respect of the classes of persons whose positions are specified in these regulations shall be deemed to have come into

force on the 1st day of September 1952.

(2) Except as provided in subclause (1) of this regulation, these regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.

**3.** (1) Regulation 3 of the special regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term "journeyman", and substituting the following definition:

"'Journeyman' means an orthopaedic technician other than a

leading hand or foreman:".

(2) Regulation 3 of the special regulations is hereby further amended

by adding the following definition:
"'Trainee' means an employee mainly or wholly engaged in receiving practical and theoretical training for the purpose of becoming an orthopaedic technician."

(3) Regulation 3 of the special regulations is hereby amended by adding to the definition of the term "orthopaedic technician" the words "and for the purposes of regulations 5 to 12 hereof includes a trainee".

4. Regulation 4 of the special regulations is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto, and substituting the following Schedule:

5. The special regulations are hereby amended by adding the following new regulation:

## " Lodging Allowances for Certain Trainees

"13. Where in the opinion of a Board a trainee is reasonably required by his circumstances to live away from home, the Board may pay him a lodging allowance according to the following scale, namely:

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations prescribe new scales of salary for orthopaedic technicians employed by Hospital Boards incorporating general increases from 1 September 1952 in conformity with general increases granted in the Public Service following the Arbitration Court's standard wage pronouncement.

They also make additional provision prescribing the remuneration and conditions

of employment of trainees in this class of work.
