ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of August 1953

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Hospitals Act 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Hospital Employment (Occupational Therapists) Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hospital Employment (Occupational Therapists) Regulations 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the special regulations).

2. These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the

1st day of September 1952.

3. Regulation 4 of the special regulations is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto, and substituting the following Schedule:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations prescribe new scales of salary for occupational therapists employed by Hospital Boards incorporating general increases from 1 September 1952 in conformity with general increases granted in the Public Service following the Arbitration Court's standard wage pronouncement and a particular adjustment of the scale for occupational therapy aids.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 13 August 1953. These regulations are administered in the Department of Health.
