ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 3rd day of July 1978

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Primary Products Marketing Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

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REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Honey Marketing Authority Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Honey Marketing Authority Regulations 1975\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Amendments of First Schedule to principal regulations**—(1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from clause 22 the expression “7 days”, and substituting the expression “the second Friday”.

(2) The said First Schedule is hereby further amended by omitting from clause 26 the words “second Wednesday in the month of September”, and substituting the words “fifth Friday after the date prescribed for receiving nominations”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations amend the First Schedule to the Honey Marketing Authority Regulations 1975, relating to the conduct of elections for producers' representatives on the Authority.

The first amendment extends the period during which the Returning Officer must send out the voting papers, and the second amendment extends the period allowed for the return of voting papers.
