ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of August 1979

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Primary Products Marketing Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

—

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Honey Marketing Authority Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Honey Marketing Authority Regulations 1975* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Amendments of First Schedule to the principal regulations—Clause (4) of the First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting the expression “25” in both places where it occurs, and substituting in each case the expression “100”;
- (b) By omitting from the first proviso the expression “100”, and substituting the expression “12”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations are made pursuant to the Primary Products Marketing Act 1953, and amend the Honey Marketing Authority Regulations 1975.

The basis on which producers are entitled to vote for representatives on the Authority is changed. At present, each producer is entitled to 1 vote for every 25 hives (or part thereof), subject to a maximum of 100 votes. Under the amendments, each producer will be entitled to 1 vote for every 100 hives (or part thereof), subject to a maximum of 12 votes.
