ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 3rd day of August 1971

PURSUANT to the Marketing Act 1936, and the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

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REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Hop Marketing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 12, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hop Marketing Regulations 1939* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Fees and travelling allowances—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 13, the following regulation:

“13A. There shall be paid to members of the Committee, from the funds administered by the Committee, remuneration by way of fees, and travelling allowances and expenses, in accordance with the Fees and Travelling Allowances Act 1951, and the provisions of that Act shall apply accordingly, and the Committee shall be a statutory Board within the meaning of that Act.”

3. Revocations—The Hop Marketing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 4, and the Hop Marketing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 10, are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Hop Marketing Regulations 1939 by declaring the Hop Marketing Committee to be a statutory Board within the meaning of the Fees and Travelling Allowances Act 1951, and enabling fees, travelling allowances, and expenses to be paid to members of the Committee in accordance with that Act rather than pursuant to the Hop Marketing Regulations 1939, Amendments Nos. 4 and 10, which are consequentially repealed.
