# THE HOP MARKETING REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT NO. 2.

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of October, 1941.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Marketing Act, 1936, and the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act, 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Hop Marketing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 2.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Hop Marketing Regulations 1939.\*
- 3. All payments of fees for attending meetings and travelling-allowances heretofore made to members of the Committee shall be deemed as valid as any similar payment that could be made after the coming into force of these regulations.
- 4. There may be paid out of the funds of the Committee to any member of the Committee for attendance at a meeting of the Committee or for attendance (pursuant to an express resolution of the Committee previously passed) to transact any business of the Committee for each day of such attendance a sum not exceeding one pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).
- 5. The Travelling-allowance Regulations 1941† shall apply to and be deemed to be incorporated in these regulations so as to relate to the Hop Marketing Committee and its members.
