ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of
December, 1944

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, and the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Heavy Motor-vehicle Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 2.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Heavy Motor-vehicle Regulations 1940* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1945.

4. Paragraph (a) of clause (8) of Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the words "solely as a tractor", and substituting therefor the words "for the purpose of drawing a trailer, whether or not the heavy motor-vehicle is laden".
