Pursuant to the Economic Stabilisation Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Hire Purchase and Credit Sales Stabilisation Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hire Purchase and Credit Sales Stabilisation Regulations 1957* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Hire Purchase and Credit Sales Stabilisation Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 4) and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) Regulation 3 of the Hire Purchase and Credit Sales Stabilisation Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 4, is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations vary the maximum period of credit in respect of furniture, furnishings, and other consumer goods from 18 to 24 months. They also reduce the minimum deposit in respect of other consumer goods from 10 per cent to 5 per cent.
