- 1. Title and commencement**— (1) This order may be cited as the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Garlic) Revocation Order 1999.
(2) This order comes into force on 31 August 1999.

2. Revocation—The Horticultural Prescribed Products (Garlic) Order 1988* is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 31 August 1999, revokes the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Garlic) Order 1988. The order is revoked at the request of the New Zealand Garlic Export Council Ltd. From the date of revocation, garlic will no longer be subject to export licensing in accordance with Part III of the New Zealand Horticulture Export Authority Act 1987. The revocation coincides with the end of the garlic export season.
