**THE HEALTH (BURIAL) REGULATIONS 1946,

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of June 1954

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Health Act 1920, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Health (Burial) Regulations 1946, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Health (Burial) Regulations 1946* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1954.

2. (1) Regulation 36 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "an infectious", and substituting the words "a communicable".

(2) Regulation 37 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "an infectious", and substituting the words "a communicable".

3. Regulations 30 and 31 of the principal regulations are hereby revoked.

4. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from form No. 1 the word "April", and substituting the word "June".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations extend the present provisions relating to the burial of persons who have died of infectious diseases, so as to make them apply to all communicable diseases. The regulations also revoke the provisions relating to burials at sea, which are now regulated by section 27 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act 1951, and correct an error in the form of application for registration as a funeral director.
