

THE HYDATIDS REGULATIONS 1970, AMENDMENT NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 6th day of June 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Hydatids Act 1968, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Hydatids Regulations 1970, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hydatids Regulations 1970* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Adjournment—Regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby amended:
 - (a) By omitting the words "Board of Appeal", and substituting the word "Magistrate":
 - (b) By omitting the words "it thinks", and substituting the words "he thinks".
- 3. Decision on appeal—Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "The Magistrate shall advise the Council whether or not the determination was unanimously arrived at."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of regulation 2 is that the Magistrate and not the Board of Appeal will have authority to adjourn the hearing of an appeal, the function of the assessors being to advise the Magistrate.

The amendment made by regulation 3 omits words from regulation 21 of the principal regulations, which are superfluous having regard to the functions of the assessors.
