



THE HYDATIDS REGULATIONS 1970, AMENDMENT NO. 2

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 6th day of September 1976

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Hydatids Act 1968, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Hydatids Regulations 1970, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Hydatids Regulations 1970* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the term “appellant”, the following definition:

“Treatment certificate” means a certificate in form 7 in the Schedule to these regulations issued by a Hydatids Control Officer or a certificate in form 8 in the Schedule to these regulations issued by a registered veterinary surgeon.”

3. Warrant for Field Advisory Officer—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 3, and substituting the following regulation:

“3. A warrant of appointment in form 1 in the Schedule to these regulations shall be issued by the Director-General to every Field Advisory Officer as evidence of his appointment as such.”

4. **Revocation of appointment**—Regulation 5 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the word “Council”, and substituting the word “Director-General”.

5. **Remuneration of assessor appointed by Council**—Regulation 23 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “the Council may pay to the assessor appointed by it”, and substituting the words “there may be paid to an assessor appointed by the Council”.

6. **Restriction of movement of dogs and production of treatment certificate**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 23, the following Part:

“PART IIA

“RESTRICTION OF MOVEMENT OF DOGS AND PRODUCTION OF
TREATMENT CERTIFICATE

“23A. **Restriction of movement of dogs into certain hydatids control districts**—The person in charge or, if there is no such person, the owner of a dog of 3 months of age or over shall prevent the dog from entering into any hydatids control district that is specified in the following list:

Provided that the person in charge or owner of a dog may permit the dog to enter such a district if—

- (a) The dog is usually kept in the district; or
- (b) The Hydatids Control Authority for the district does not require that dogs in the district be treated for hydatids at intervals of 42 days or less; or
- (c) The person in charge or owner of the dog holds a treatment certificate that shows that the dog has been treated for hydatids during the period of 42 days preceding the day the dog enters the district.

“23B. Circumstances in which treatment certificate must be shown—

(1) When a person sells or otherwise disposes of a dog of 3 months of age or over to any other person, he shall show to that other person a treatment certificate in respect of that dog.

“(2) The owner or person in charge of a dog of 3 months of age or over that is at a dog trial, competition, show, or sale shall, before permitting the dog to take part therein, show to the organiser thereof, or his representative, or (if requested by a Hydatids Control Officer) to that Officer, a treatment certificate in respect of that dog.

“(3) The owner or person in charge of a dog of 3 months of age or over that is in a hydatids control district other than the district in which it is usually kept shall, upon request by a Hydatids Control Officer or the owner or occupier of any land on which the dog has entered, show to that Officer, owner, or occupier a treatment certificate in respect of that dog.”

7. Offences—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 24, the following regulation:

“24A. Every person who fails to comply with any requirement of these regulations or does any act in contravention of these regulations commits an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$40.”

8. Warrant of appointment of Field Advisory Officer—The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking form 1, and substituting the form 1 set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.

9. Forms of treatment certificates—The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby further amended by adding the forms set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Hydatids Regulations 1970.

Regulation 2 inserts a definition of the term "treatment certificate" in regulation 2 of the principal regulations.

Regulation 3 substitutes a new regulation 3 in the principal regulations (which relates to warrants for Field Advisory Officers). The new regulation provides that such warrants are to be issued by the Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries (rather than by the National Hydatids Council). This amendment is consequential upon the Hydatids Amendment Act 1975.

Regulation 4 makes a consequential amendment.

Regulation 5 amends regulation 23 of the principal regulations (which relates to remuneration of assessors appointed by the Council). This amendment is consequential upon the Hydatids Amendment Act 1975 and the effect of the regulation remains the same.

Regulation 6 inserts a new Part IIA in the principal regulations. The new Part consists of 2 regulations.

The new regulation 23A provides that the person in charge or owner of a dog shall prevent it from entering into any hydatids control district specified in the regulation unless—

- (a) The dog is usually kept in the district; or
- (b) The district does not require dogs to be treated for hydatids every 42 days; or
- (c) The person in charge or owner of the dog holds a treatment certificate showing that the dog has been treated for hydatids during the preceding 42 days.

The new regulation 23B provides that the owner or person in charge of a dog must show a treatment certificate in respect of the dog—

- (a) When the person sells or otherwise disposes of the dog;
- (b) When the dog is at a dog trial, competition, show, or sale;
- (c) When the dog is out of its own hydatids control district and the owner or occupier of any land on which the dog has entered, or a Hydatids Control Officer, has requested the owner or person in charge to do so.

Regulation 7 inserts a new regulation 24A in the principal regulations. The new regulation relates to offences.

Regulation 8 substitutes a new form 1 (warrant of appointment of Field Advisory Officer) in the Schedule to the principal regulations.

Regulation 9 inserts new forms 7 and 8 (treatment certificates) in the Schedule to the principal regulations.
