**THE HEALTH (DRAINLAYERS' REGISTRATION)
REGULATIONS 1948, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of November 1953

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Health Act 1920, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Health (Drainlayers' Registration) Regulations 1948, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Health (Drainlayers' Registration) Regulations 1948* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December 1953.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 7, the following new regulation:

“7A. Before presenting himself for examination, each candidate shall produce to the person to whom his application is made written evidence, to the satisfaction of that person, that he has worked as a drainlayer, under the supervision of a registered drainlayer, for not less than six months during the period of one year immediately preceding the date of his application.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

The effect of this amendment is that every candidate for examination in drain-laying must, before presenting himself for examination, produce to the examiner satisfactory written evidence that he has worked as a drainlayer, under the supervision of a registered drainlayer, for not less than six months during the year preceding the date of his application to be examined.
