PURSUANT to section 20 (2) of the Health Service Personnel Act 1983, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

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ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Health Service Personnel (Principal Officers) Order 1984, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Health Service Personnel (Principal Officers) Order 1984\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Principal officers of certain area health boards**—The Northland Area Health Board, the Nelson Area Health Board, and the Wanganui Area Health Board shall each have 3 principal officers, with the following respective designations:

- (a) The chief executive of the board:
- (b) The chief medical officer of the board:
- (c) The chief nurse of the board.

**3. Schedule amended**—The Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by omitting the items relating to the Nelson Hospital Board, the Northland Hospital Board, and the Wanganui Hospital Board.

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EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

The order specifies the number of principal officers to be appointed by each of the area health boards, and their respective designations. The principal effect is to require the boards to follow the procedure set out in section 20 of the Act in appointing any such officer.
