

# THE IMMIGRATION (ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE) REGULATIONS 1986

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 13th day of October 1986

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to section 38 of the Immigration Act 1964, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Immigration (Arrival and Departure) Regulations 1986.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- **2. Interpretation**—In these regulations "the Act" means the Immigration Act 1964.
- **3. Forms of declarations**—(1) Subject to regulation 4 (2) of these regulations, every declaration required by section 33 (1) of the Act to be made by a person on entering New Zealand shall be made in form 1 in the Schedule to these regulations.

- (2) Subject to regulation 4 (2) of these regulations, every declaration required by section 33 (1) of the Act to be made by a person on leaving New Zealand shall be made in form 2 in the Schedule to these regulations.
- (3) Any form prescribed by these regulations may form part of or be included in a document which also, for the purposes of any enactment, contains other material or forms for the information of or completion by persons entering or leaving New Zealand.
- **4. Revocation and saving**—(1) The Immigration (Arrival and Departure) Regulations (No. 2) 1981\* are hereby revoked.
- (2) Notwithstanding the revocation of the Immigration (Arrival and Departure) Regulations (No. 2) 1981 by subclause (1) of this regulation, any declaration required by section 33 (1) of the Act shall be sufficient if made in the appropriate form prescribed by those regulations instead of the appropriate form prescribed by these regulations.

## Immigration Guidelines

Unless you are a New Zealand citizen you must apply for a permit or exemption from a permit.

- You may claim an exemption from a permit if you are: an Australian citizen;
  - a Commonwealth or Irish citizen with the right to reside permanently in Australia and you are arriving direct from
  - a person granted diplomatic or consular privileges in New Zealand;
  - a member of Commonwealth armed forces on duty in New Zealand:
  - a crew member, or a cruise ship passenger whose ship is in port.
- You may apply for a temporary permit (not working) if you intend a short visit and know you are not required to hold a visa; or if you hold the correct visa or entry authority.
- You may apply for a temporary permit (working) or student permit or permanent residence permit if you already hold the correct visa or entry authority.

### Important Notice

You may be refused a permit or an exemption from holding a permit if you:

- have been convicted and sentenced to prison or detention for 12 months or more;
- have been deported from New Zealand or any other country.

If you think you may be refused a permit or an exemption from holding a permit, do not sign the Arrival Declaration — ask to talk to an Immigration Officer as soon as you arrive.

#### **NEW ZEALAND**

#### PASSENGER DEPARTURE CARD

- A separate card must be completed by or for each passenger including one for each child or baby, and given to an Immigration Officer at port of departure from New Zealand.
- If a person is incapecitated or a child is under 15 years of age the card may be completed by one parent, guardian, or accompanying adult.
- 3. For guidance in completing cards:
  - Q 8 The particular job or type of work you do—use definite terms, e.g., write primary school teacher or music teacher rather than teacher; metalworking machinist not machinist, etc.
  - Q 9 "Stopover" refers to passengers whose MAIN reason for staying one night or more in New Zealand (i.e. while in transit) is because they had to wait in New Zealand for an onward connection by aircraft or ship.
  - Q 11 Copy from your ticket or boarding pass.
  - Q 15 New Zealand residents departing permanently are not required to answer this question.
- 4. The declaration overleaf is required of all persons leaving New Zealand, under the Immigration Act 1964. Any person who makes any statement in this declaration which is in any respect wilfully false or misleading commits an offence and is liable to imprisonment, or to a fine, or to both.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general affect.

These regulations revoke and replace the Immigration (Arrival and Departure) Regulations (No. 2) 1981. They substitute new forms of declarations required by section 33 of the Immigration Act 1964 to be made by persons entering or leaving New Zealand.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette:* 16 October 1986. These regulations are administered in the Department of Labour.
