THE RIGHT HONOURABLE K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Industrial and Provident Societies Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Industrial and Provident Societies Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Industrial and Provident Societies Regulations 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 5, the following heading and regulation:

“OFFICE HOURS

“5A. (1) The office of each District Registrar shall be open to the public for the transaction of business daily (except on Sundays, Saturdays, and holidays), during such hours as the Registrar of Industrial and Provident Societies fixes from time to time, either generally or in any particular case.

“(2) In this regulation the term ‘holidays’ includes—

“(a) Any day falling during the period commencing on the 25th day of December and ending with the 2nd day of January:

“(b) Where the 2nd day of January falls on a Saturday, the 4th day of January:

“(c) Where the 2nd day of January falls on a Sunday, the 3rd and 4th days of January:

“(d) Good Friday:

“(e) Easter Monday:

“(f) Anzac Day:

“(g) The Sovereign’s birthday:

“(h) The holiday observed in the locality as Anniversary Day:

“(i) Labour Day.

“(3) Every day which is a holiday within the meaning of this regulation shall, in relation to any document that is required to be registered or deposited in the office of any District Registrar, be deemed to be a holiday within the meaning of paragraph (a) of section 25 of the Acts Interpretation Act 1924 (which relates to the extension of the time for doing anything where the time prescribed in that behalf expires on a holiday).”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations define the times at which offices of District Registrars of Industrial and Provident Societies are required to be open to the public for the transaction of business.
