# ORDER IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Plants Act 1970, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Introduction and Quarantine of Plants Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Introduction and Quarantine of Plants Regulations 1973\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
  - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1976.
- 2. Fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Ninth Schedule, and substituting the Ninth Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
