ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Plants Act 1970, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Introduction and Quarantine of Plants Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Introduction and Quarantine of Plants Regulations 1973* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1976.

2. Fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Ninth Schedule, and substituting the Ninth Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

‘NINTH SCHEDULE Regs. 25, 26 (2), 27, 29 (e)

SCALE OF FEES FOR INSPECTION, FUMIGATION, DESTRUCTION, AND OTHER TREATMENT OF IMPORTED FRUIT, GOODS, PLANTS, AND SEEDS, AND INSPECTION OF PLANTS AND NURSERY STOCK IN QUARANTINE

1. For inspection of plant material imported in packages—

- 2. For fumigation and other treatment—
 - (a) Fruit contained in packages that are customarily used for the type of fruit—
 - First 100 packages 15c a package
 - All packages in excess of 100 .. 10c a package
 - Minimum charge 75c
 - (b) Seeds, grain, and other goods in sacks or bags—
 - First 30 packages 45c a package
 - All packages in excess of 30 .. 25c a package
 - Minimum charge 75c
 - (c) Plants and other goods in containers other than sacks or bags—also fruit in packages other than those customarily used for the type of fruit—
 - (i) Not exceeding 0.1 cubic metres 90c
 - (ii) When consignment exceeds 0.1 cubic metres, as follows:
 - Each 0.5 cubic metres or part thereof, up to 3 cubic metres \$2.25
 - Each 0.5 cubic metres or part thereof, in excess of 3 cubic metres \$1.15
- 3. For destruction of a consignment or part consignment of goods—
 - (a) Each package of up to 0.1 cubic metres .. 0.45
 - (b) Each package exceeding 0.1 cubic metres .. 0.75
 - (c) Minimum fee under this clause .. 0.75
 - (d) Maximum fee under this clause .. 22.50
- 4. For inspection, while in quarantine, of nursery stock, bulbs, corms, rhizomes, and tubers or ornamental plants—
 - (a) Every 50, and any number fewer than 50 \$2.25
 - (b) Maximum fee under this clause .. 70.00
- 5. For inspection, while in quarantine, of plants grown from seed—
 - (a) Every 400 sq. metres or part thereof .. 2.25
 - (b) Maximum fee under this clause .. 70.00
- 6. For inspection of plants growing on a quarantine station—\$1.50 per annum per unit.
