**THE INDUSTRIAL CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION
AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1950**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Regulations 1950, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Regulations 1927* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) The principal regulations and these regulations and the previous amendments of the principal regulations now in force† may be cited together as the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Regulations 1927-50.

2. (1) The Travelling-allowance Regulations 1949‡ shall apply to and be deemed to be incorporated in these regulations so as to relate to the Court and Conciliation Councils, and to members of the Court, Conciliation Commissioners, and assessors appointed to Conciliation Councils.

(2) The subsistence allowance referred to in Regulation 5 of the Travelling-allowance Regulations 1949 shall be at the rate of £1 15s. a day :

Provided that where an assessor is appointed to a Conciliation Council in accordance with section 41 or section 43 of the said Act on behalf of an industrial union registered under section 5 or section 10 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1936, or of an industrial association, the assessor shall only be paid

a subsistence allowance under this regulation with the prior approval of the Secretary of Labour if in the opinion of the Conciliation Commissioner his appointment as an assessor is desirable for the purpose of facilitating a settlement of the dispute :

Provided further that when more than one assessor is appointed on behalf of any such union or association an allowance under this regulation shall be granted to one assessor only.

(3) Where any person is entitled to a subsistence allowance pursuant to this regulation and occupies a hotel room for one night only, an amount of 2s. in addition to the subsistence allowance may be paid to that person.

(4) The mileage allowance referred to in Regulation 13 of the Travelling-allowance Regulations 1949 shall be calculated in accordance with the following table :—

Horse-power of Car.	Mileage Allowance.
Not exceeding 9½	5½d. a mile.
Exceeding 9½ but not exceeding 14½	6½d. a mile.
Over 14½	7d. a mile.

(5) Garage expenses payable to a person pursuant to this regulation shall not exceed 2s. 6d. for every night on which any such expenses are incurred.

(6) For the purposes of this regulation any person entitled to a subsistence allowance thereunder shall be deemed to be a member within the meaning of the Travelling-allowance Regulations 1949.

3. Regulation 68 of the principal regulations (as set out in Regulation 3 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Regulations 1947) is hereby amended as follows :—

- (a) By omitting from subclause (1) the expression “ £1 10s.,” and substituting the expression “ £1 15s. ” :
- (b) By revoking the proviso to subclause (1) :
- (c) By omitting from subclause (2) the expression “ £1 10s.,” and substituting the expression “ £1 15s. ”

4. Regulations 66 and 69 of the principal regulations, the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Regulations 1946, Regulation 2 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Regulations 1947, and Regulation 3 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Regulations 1949 are hereby revoked.
