



**THE IMPORT CONTROL (METHYL BROMIDE) CONDITIONAL
PROHIBITION ORDER 1994**

PURSUANT to section 3 of the Import Control Act 1988, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Import Control (Methyl Bromide) Conditional Prohibition Order 1994.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1995.

2. Conditional prohibition on importation of methyl bromide—(1) Subject to subclause (2) of this clause, the importation into New Zealand of the following goods is hereby prohibited—

(a) (Mono) bromomethane (CH₃Br);

(b) Goods that have as a constituent goods of the kind referred to in paragraph (a) of this subclause.

(2) The goods referred to in subclause (1) of this clause may be imported into New Zealand under the authority of a permit to be granted by the Minister of Commerce upon or subject to such terms or conditions (if any) as may be imposed by the Minister.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 January 1995, prohibits the importation of methyl bromide and goods of which methyl bromide is a constituent unless the importation is permitted by the Minister of Commerce.
