PURSUANT to the Police Offences Act 1927 and section 38 of the Statutes Amendment Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General hereby gives notice as follows.

NOTICE

1. This notice may be cited as the International Criminal Police Organisation Name Notice 1962.

2. No person shall use in connection with any trade or business— (a) The name of the International Criminal Police Organisation;

- (b) The word Interpol; or
- (c) Any other name, word, seal, emblem, or device having reference in any way to the International Criminal Police Organisation.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This notice makes it an offence under Part I of the Police Offences Act 1927 to use in connection with any trade or business the name of the International Criminal Police Organisation or any word or emblem having reference to the International Criminal Police Organisation. In subsection (4) of section 38 of the Statutes Amendment Act 1948 it is provided that every person who acts in contravention of this notice is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding $\pounds 10$.
