

THE INFECTIOUS DISEASES ORDER 1965

Pursuant to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Infectious Diseases Order 1965.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1965.
- 2. The First Schedule to the Health Act 1956 (as substituted by section 2 (2) of the Health Amendment Act 1962 and as amended by clause 2 (2) of the Infectious Diseases Order 1964*) is hereby further amended—
 - (a) By omitting from Section A of Part I the words "Cerebro-spinal fever (cerebro-spinal meningitis)":
 - (b) By inserting in the said Section A, after the words "Leptospiral infections", the words "Meningococcal meningitis".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is that, as from 1 April 1965, cerebro-spinal meningitis ceases to be a notifiable infectious disease under the Health Act 1956 and meningococcal meningitis becomes such a disease.
