

THE INFECTIOUS DISEASES ORDER 1966

Pursuant to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Infectious Diseases Order 1966. (2) This order shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. The First Schedule to the Health Act 1956 (as substituted by section 2 (2) of the Health Amendment Act 1962 and as amended by clause 2 (2) of the Infectious Diseases Order 1964* and by clause 2 of the Infectious Diseases Order 1965†) is hereby further amended by inserting in Section A of Part I, after the word "Poliomyelitis", the word "Rabies".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order makes rabies a notifiable infectious disease under the Health Act 1956.
