ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 3rd day of February 1969

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Infectious Diseases Order 1969.
 (2) This order shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The First Schedule to the Health Act 1956 (as substituted by section 2 (2) of the Health Amendment Act 1962 and as amended by clause 2 (2) of the Infectious Diseases Order 1964*, clause 2 of the Infectious Diseases Order 1965†, and clause 2 of the Infectious Diseases Order 1966‡) is hereby further amended—

- (a) By inserting in the Section A of Part I, before the word "Anthrax.", the words "Acute infective encephalitis.":
- (b) By omitting from the said Section A the words "Encephalitis lethargica."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order substitutes acute infective encephalitis for encephalitis lethargica as a notifiable infectious disease under the Health Act 1956.
