ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 29th day of May 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Infectious Diseases Order 1972.

(2) This order shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Congenital rubella—The First Schedule to the Health Act 1956 (as substituted by section 2 (2) of the Health Amendment Act 1962 and as amended by clause 2 (2) of the Infectious Diseases Order 1964*, clause 2 of the Infectious Diseases Order 1965†, clause 2 of the Infectious Diseases Order 1966‡, clause 2 of the Infectious Diseases Order 1969§, clause 2 of the Infectious Diseases Order (No. 2) 1969||, and clause 2 of the Infectious Diseases Order 1971¶), is hereby further amended—

- (a) By inserting in section B of Part I, before the item “Leprosy.”, the item “Congenital rubella.”; and
- (b) By adding, to the item that commences with the word “Measles” in Part II, the words “other than congenital rubella”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order makes congenital rubella a notifiable disease under the Health Act 1956. It is notifiable to the Medical Officer of Health only and not to the local authority.
