PURSUANT to section 3 (a) of the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Infectious Diseases Order 1983.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. New notifiable infectious disease—The First Schedule to the Health Act 1956 (as substituted by section 5 of the Health Amendment Act 1982) is hereby amended by inserting in section B of Part I, before the item "campylobacter infection", the item "Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order adds the disease known as Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) to the list of infectious diseases that are notifiable to the local Medical Officer of Health.
