**THE INDUSTRIAL EFFICIENCY (MOTOR-SPIRITS LICENSING)
REGULATIONS (NO. 2) 1938, AMENDMENT NO. 1.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 9th day of June, 1939.

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Efficiency (Motor-spirits Licensing) Regulations (No. 2) 1938, Amendment No. 1.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Industrial Efficiency (Motor-spirits Licensing) Regulations (No. 2) 1938* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.†
4. Clause 23 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted :—
 “ 23. If an application for a license or an application to vary the conditions of an existing license by increasing the number of pumps stated thereon be granted, the amount of the license fee hereinbefore prescribed shall be reduced or satisfied, as the case may be, by the amount of the application fee as set out in clauses 6, 10, and 17, whichever is applicable, paid by the licensee.”
5. Clause 24 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the words “ Clause 11 ”, and substituting the words “ Clauses 7 and 11 ”.
6. Clause 24 of the principal regulations is further amended by revoking the words “ prescribed by clause 10 hereof ”, and substituting the words “ prescribed by clauses 6 and 10 hereof, whichever is applicable ”.

7. The principal regulations are amended by inserting, next after clause 19 thereof, the following additional heading and clause :—

“ 19A. Every application for leave to transfer a license shall be made to the Bureau of Industry in writing signed by or on behalf of either the licensee or the proposed transferee, and shall be accompanied by an application fee of £2.”
